COVID-19 Vaccine Guidance and Resources

As the guidance for the COVID-19 vaccine continues to evolve, the Mobile Area Chamber of Commerce is working to provide you the latest information regarding the vaccine. We are continuing to monitor the procedure for onsite inoculations for 500 or more and will provide more information as it becomes available.

Am I Eligible?

While the current vaccine supply is limited, it is necessary to prioritize vaccinations for those who are at the highest risk of getting the virus or becoming seriously ill. Alabama has worked with stakeholders and has followed guidelines provided by the federal government to develop the [Alabama COVID-19 Vaccination Allocation Plan](#)

Where Do I Go?

Mobile County has been selected by the Alabama Department of Public Health to be part of its initiative for mass vaccination clinics. There is no cost to receive a vaccine, but everyone vaccinated must be in an eligible group, wear a mask and bring valid identification.

What Do I Need to Do After Receiving the Vaccine?

You should return to the same location to get your second dose on the date specified on your check-out card.

It is advised that you continue to wear a mask and socially distance because herd immunity has not yet been achieved.
